

FRANCOPHONE MOBILITY PROGRAM

The Francophone Mobility Program (FMP) is a Canadian initiative designed to make it easier for employers outside Quebec to hire skilled French-speaking foreign workers. This program allows these employers to hire workers without needing to obtain a Labour Market Impact Assessment (LMIA), a process that can be time-consuming and require demonstrating efforts to recruit Canadian citizens or permanent residents

Key Features of the Francophone Mobility Program:

• LMIA Exemption:

The primary benefit is that employers are exempt from the need to obtain an LMIA when hiring Francophone workers, simplifying the hiring process.

• Targeted Recruitment:

The program focuses on recruiting skilled French-speaking workers to address shortages in specific regions and sectors across Canada, outside of Quebec.

• Benefits for Employers:

This program helps employers tap into a new pool of skilled talent, potentially opening new markets or expanding their reach.

Support for Francophone Communities:

By attracting skilled French-speaking workers, the FMP contributes to the growth and vitality of Francophone communities outside Quebec.

• Work Permit:

The FMP facilitates the issuance of work permits to eligible Francophone workers, allowing them to live and work in Canada.

No Age Limit:

The program is open to individuals of all ages, making it a valuable resource for a diverse range of skills and experience.
